Ceralink Moves to Rensselaer Tech Park

Albany, NY – Ceralink Inc., a materials engineering and technology commercialization service, announces their move to a new location at the Rensselaer Technology Park in Troy, NY (Albany region). This move represents a growing phase for Ceralink as they graduate from the Ceramics Corridor Innovation Center (CCIC) incubator in Alfred, NY and move into a Tech Park.

Ceralink, founded by Dr. Holly S. Shulman, was launched from the CCIC incubator in January 2001. The business has since grown to 5 skilled employees and an anticipated annual sales level of \$500k in 2004. The larger, more modern facility at the Tech Park accommodates Ceralink's growing service business and expanding Microwave Testing Center.

“Our relocation to the Albany/Tech Valley area offers Ceralink tremendous opportunities,” says Dr. Shulman. “Albany is experiencing strong economic growth, and this move gives us higher visibility as well as access to a larger pool of skilled labor and quality equipment.”

The Rensselaer Technology Park has a close relationship with Rensselaer Polytechnic Institute (RPI), located a few miles away. Ceralink is now an affiliate member of RPI which gives them easy access to top class facilities and faculty at this world renowned technological research university. RPI also houses the Rensselaer Nanotechnology Center, and Albany NanoTech is nearby at SUNY Albany.
